Around the House (1) – Hotel Business Centre

In the past, One Wall residents were entitled to free use of the hotel business centre. However, this policy was discontinued a couple of years ago, when the business centre was substantially upgraded and relocated.

If you want to use the business centre now, you will need to book your time via the hotel front desk, and provide a credit card number. (This may be billable to your One Wall account in future.)

The standard charge is \$5.95 for 45 minutes of computer use. Black and white printed pages cost 40 cents apiece, and colour ones are \$1.

If you have old computers, televisions and the like to dispose of, please put them beside, not in, our garbage bins. Electronics have to be taken to a specialized recycling facility, as they may contain lead, mercury and/or cadmium.
