Around Town (1) - Bhangra on Main

And now for something multi-cultural: Music on Main and the Vancouver International Bhangra Celebration join forces for an evening celebrating the origins of Bhangra.

Don't miss UK Bhangra star <u>Dalvinder Singh</u> in an intimate concert that traces Bhangra's roots to traditional Punjabi folk music and love songs. Think "MTV Unplugged," a great pop artist performing an intimate set on acoustic instruments.



Singing and playing harmonium, Dalvinder will be joined by a band featuring mandolin, guitar, tabla, and dholak (Indian drums). Together they will perform Punjabi folk music and love songs, and acoustic versions of Dalvinder's recent hits. The concert will take place at Heritage Hall, 3102 Main Street at East 15<sup>th</sup>, on Tuesday June 5<sup>th</sup>, at 8pm.

Around Town (2) - The Last Night of the Proms

This concert, a tradition started in 1895 at the Royal Albert Hall in London, has also become a VSO and Vancouver Bach Choir institution. Maestro Tovey proudly upholds the tradition in a performance featuring Pomp & Circumstance, God Save the Queen, Jerusalem, and much more!

You will also look at unique private singlefamily homes, which range from a cozy and comfortable home filled with an amazing collection of vintage furniture and antiques, to a lovely South Granville home with plenty of original features.



This self-guided tour gives you a whole day to get yourself to the homes and talk with homeowners, architects and experts in construction and heritage. See how others are living in heritage and get inspiration for your own project, or just marvel at the creativity and diversity of options found in character and heritage homes.

Around Town (5) – 12 Minutes Max

12 Minutes Max showcases five eclectic contemporary dance works each lasting 12 minutes or less, by some of Vancouver's most exciting and innovative up-and-coming choreographers: Caitlin Griffin, Con8 Collective (Charlotte Newman and Georgina Alpen), MAYCE (Robert Azevedo, Antonio Somera, and Marisa Gold), Natalie Tin Yin Gan and Francesca Frewer, and Naomi Brand.



A much-loved performance series first launched in Vancouver in 1994, 12 Minutes Max has been revived after a hiatus and focuses on providing support, feedback and performance opportunities to emerging dance artists, with a rotating panel of curators.

It takes place on Friday June 12<sup>th</sup>, at the Scotiabank Dance Centre.

Around Town (6) – Goh Ballet Presents: The Quest of Don Quixote

The future stars of ballet in Vancouver's own Goh Company unveil *The Quest of Don Quixote*, with stunning new choreography by their award-winning faculty. This re-imagined journey of our noble knight blends elements of visual art on screen with pure balletic movements on stage. Be amused and moved on this quest to find the ideal woman.

Around Town (7) - Up for a Challenge?

The Scotiabank Half Marathon takes runners on a scenic point-to-point course from UBC to Stanley Park. With a net drop of almost 300ft, and a consistently competitive elite field, this event has produced the fastest half-marathon times ever recorded in BC. Combine this with numerous bands, water stations, great medals, a finish line party, and you're set for your best half-marathon yet!

Not up for a half-marathon? The event also hosts a family-friendly 5k route which takes runners along the trails of Stanley Park and the Seawall of English Bay, before merging with the Half-Marathon to finish in Stanley Park.



Since the first race in 1998, almost \$5 million has been raised from sponsorships and donations for over 80 local charities.

Runners will be laced up on June 28th.

Around Town (8) - Centro Flamenco Rosario

Founded in 1989, Centro Flamenco was the first school in Western Canada that provided carefully structured and progressive training in the art of flamenco. They are justifiably proud of the many dancers, amateur and professional, they have nurtured. "We have planted the seeds, we are collecting the fruit".



They present their new production *La Cosecha* on June 20<sup>th</sup>. Castanets will be clicked at the Playhouse, at 8pm on June 20<sup>th</sup>.



Around Town (9) – Jesse Cook at the Queen Elizabeth Theatre

Based in Toronto, Jesse Cook has been recording and performing music internationally for almost 20 years. He is a JUNO Award-winning artist and three-time recipient of the Canadian Smooth Jazz Award for Guitarist of the Year. His previous release, The Rumba Foundation, continued the journey he has travelled ever since he was first exposed to rumba flamenco while visiting his father in Arles in the south of France.



Those who have never before experienced Cook's creativity will find themselves tapping their feet to these extraordinary Latin rhythms and wondering why they have not experienced Cook before. With over one million album sales worldwide, Jesse Cook has spawned a truly global fan base.

He appears in Vancouver for one night only, on June 4<sup>th</sup>.





Around Town (10) - Return of the Bard

Vancouver's celebration of all things Shakespearian opens for the summer season in the tents at Vanier Park on June 4<sup>th</sup>.
