Around Town (1) - Last Night of the Proms

The Vancouver Symphony Orchestra presents Last Night of the Proms, a beloved concert tradition originating with the BBC Symphony's *Promenade* series, and still going strong so many years later. *Last Night of the Proms* is a fun-filled spectacle brimming with popular light classics and patriotic tunes such as *Jerusalem* and Elgar's *Pomp and Circumstance March No. 1*, plus Big Band Classics from the 40s and 50s.



Maestro Bramwell Tovey conducts and hosts with his trademark wit and flair. And not to be missed is a special appearance by Vancouver music legend Dal Richards and his band.

The concert is on Wednesday June 8th, at 8pm, and takes place just a few blocks from One Wall, at the Orpheum Theatre on Granville Street.

Around Town (2) - Supertramp

For all you ageing rockers out there, Wednesday June 1st is a date to circle on your calendar, when classic rockers Supertramp will appear at the Rogers Arena.

This year Supertramp are celebrating 40 years in the Rock and Roll business, and they are bringing their show to Vancouver for just this one night in June

Once again joining Supertramp's founder, lead singer and keyboardist, Rick Davies, are legendary Supertramp members John Anthony Helliwell, saxophones and woodwinds, and Bob Siebenberg, drums.

Veterans of past Supertramp tours, Jesse Siebenberg, lead vocals, guitars and percussion, Cliff Hugo, bass, Carl Verheyen, guitars and Lee Thornburg, horns, will round out the lineup. Cassie Miller and Gabe Dixon, who joined the band last fall, are back too.



Rick Davies, along with set and lighting designer Michael Brian Duncan, have developed a new stage production that excites audiences with a classic Supertramp experience, a delight for both the eyes and ears. Reviews of the shows were very positive throughout the 2010 European tour, fueling the demand for these new shows in 2011.

The band will again perform a plethora of classics from their forty-year history, including Bloody Well Right, Dreamer, From Now On, Goodbye Stranger, The Logical Song, Rudy and many, many more.

The concert is at 8pm, and tickets are available at the usual outlets.

Around Town (3) - Rihanna

Also appearing at Rogers Arena this month is Rihanna. Rihanna, sparking a fan frenzy with her sold out 45 date European tour, including six nights at London's O2 Arena, announced that she will bring her highly anticipated LOUD tour to North America this summer.

Rihanna's extraordinary new show will feature an all new production, new costumes and stage design creating a visual and audio event with the once in a lifetime excitement her fans around the world have come to expect from one of the brightest stars in music today.

"We're creating an incredible ride with this tour. I'm excited to get out on the road and share my new music from this album." said Rihanna. "We are going to have an amazing time and I know my fans are ready to get Loud!" Rihanna's 2010 global tour, Last Girl On Earth drew nearly 500,000 fans in 44 markets.

Rihanna has sold a collective 22 million albums and 36 million digital singles since her debut in 2005.

For over 20 years, the arrival of the Bard on the Beach Shakespeare Festival means that summer is here (despite what the weather forecast may say.) The Festival has cultivated a reputation as one of the best theatre festivals in Canada. This year's roster of plays includes As You Like It, The Merchant of Venice, Henry VI War of the Roses, and Richard III. The season starts on June 2nd, and runs until early September.
