Around Town (2) – "Somebody's going to Get a Hurt"

Canada's biggest comedy export, global comedy rock star, Russell Peters returns to Canada on his Notorious World Tour.

"I can't wait to get back home and get in front of the Canadian fans who made me who I am today," says Peters. Peters has spent the last three years setting attendance records around the globe; in 2009, he had the largest comedy show in UK history at London's O2 Arena with 16,000 fans in attendance. He repeated that same feat in 2010 at Sydney, Australia's Acer Arena, where he had the largest comedy show in Australian history with over 13,000 fans in attendance. His two shows in Dubai sold out in eight minutes - faster than Madonna's, and received rave reviews.



Peters has also performed for the troops in Afghanistan, Iraq and on the USS Eisenhower and HMCS Winnipeg, and has appeared on The Tonight Show with Jay Leno, Lopez Tonight, Jimmy Kimmel Live, The Late Late Show with Craig Ferguson and on HBO, CNN, MTV, BBC and Al Jazeera. He can also be seen in the upcoming movie, Girl in Progress with Eva Mendes.

He appears at Rogers Arena on Saturday June 23<sup>rd</sup> starting at 7pm. If you decide to go, expect Sexual Content and Adult Language.



Around Town (3) - Parade of Renovated Homes

On June 10<sup>th</sup> the Greater Vancouver Home Builders' Association hosts the 19<sup>th</sup> reprise of this annual event. Those of you interested in checking out some beautifully renovated Vancouver-area homes will want to mark June 10<sup>th</sup> on your calendar. From 10am until 4pm you are invited to tour eight professionally renovated homes in Burnaby, North Vancouver, Surrey and Vancouver

The tour will showcase leading-edge design, advanced construction techniques and products, and energy-saving features. The renovations will include the revitalization of a 1950s bungalow, the restoration of a 1920s Vancouver heritage home, the conversion of a Westside basement suite and a contemporary whole-house transformation.



Admission is by passport, available at each home for \$10 per person. Part of the proceeds will help fund the purchase of tools, building materials and safety gear for a carpentry training program offered by Guildford Park and Frank Hurt secondary schools in Surrey.
