Around Town (1) – Janina Fialkowska

The world-renowned Polish piano virtuoso will be in Vancouver to play Chopin (what else) this month. Her concert takes place in Magee Theatre, which is located within Magee Secondary School, at 6360 Maple Street, close to 49th Avenue.



Beloved the world over for her exquisite pianism, Janina Fialkowska has enchanted audiences for over thirty years with her glorious lyrical sound, her sterling musicianship and her profound sense of musical integrity. Celebrated for her interpretations of the classical and romantic repertoire, she is particularly distinguished as one of the great interpreters of the piano works of Chopin and Mozart.

Born to a Canadian mother and a Polish father in Montreal, Janina Fialkowska started to study the piano at the age of five. In 1974 her career was launched by Arthur Rubinstein after her prize-winning performance at his inaugural Master Piano Competition in Israel.

Ms Fialkowska's recent recordings include performances of piano concertos by Chopin and Mozart in authentic versions consisting of piano and string quintet accompaniment. Both were released to the highest critical acclaim.

The Chopin Recital CD made it into the Gramophone classic charts as well as being amongst the London Sunday Times Top 10 "Best classical recordings of the year." It also received a nomination for the "International Classical Music Award 2011." Ms Fialkowska is an Officer of the Order of Canada and holds honorary doctorates from Acadia University and Queen's

University.

Around Town (2) – Chutzpah! 2012

Chutzpah is the quality of impudence. The word derives from a Hebrew word meaning impertinence. The modern English usage of the word has taken on a wider, positive meaning to express admiration for non-conformist but gutsy audacity. The Chutzpah! Festival is a dynamic multi-disciplinary performing arts festival featuring both established and emerging professional artists from across Canada and around the world.



Chutzpah! nurtures interaction and dialogue amongst different artistic disciplines and between artists, both nationally and internationally. It also brings together diverse groups and different generations within the Lower Mainland in a shared and accessible celebration of the performing arts. Chutzpah!'s main home is the state-of-the-art 318-seat Norman Rothstein Theatre and the JCCGV is a busy gathering place that draws thousands of people from the Jewish community and well beyond.

This year Chutzpah! continues to expand programming into other venues – River Rock Show Theatre, Commodore Ballroom, Electric Owl and Firehall Arts Centre – to attract new and diverse audiences.

The Festival, now in its 12th year, begins late in February and runs throughout March. More information is available at www.chutzpahfestival.com.



Around Town (3) - International Dance Festival

The Dance Festival Society exists to increase public appreciation of culturally diverse contemporary dance. It presents high quality dance performances and workshops by outstanding dance artists. It also commissions new culturally diverse dance works, and strives to increase the local audience for such programs.



The Festival is now in its 12th year, and their performance venues are the Roundhouse and the Centre for the Performing Arts. The program runs from March 2nd until the 11th. All details can be found at www.vidf.ca.

From February 27th until March 4th the Vancouver Playhouse presents the International Wine Festival, now in its 34th year. The focus in 2012 is on the wines of Chile (yum, yum), though wines from many other parts of the world will be on offer too.
