Around the House (1) – Hotel Limousine Rides to/from YVR

As many residents know, rides to the airport in the hotel car need to be booked one week in advance. You would think that booking even earlier would guarantee you a ride, but actually it doesn't. The head bellman at the hotel staffs his positions based on the forecasts of arrivals and departures for the coming week.

Until he knows the numbers, he can't tell if he'll have any slack to allow for rides. It's a free service for our residents, of course, but for that reason it has to be subject to availability. We do the best we can to book rides.

Around the House (3) – The Dreaded "One Wall Rate"

One Wall residents can book rooms at the Sheraton for family and friends at the One Wall Rate, which is 50% of the rack rate. Please contact us at the desk if you would like us to make reservations for you.

Sometimes there are room rates available through the Internet that are lower than ours. Note, though, that reservations made via the One Wall Concierge desk can be cancelled for a full refund up until 6pm of the expected night of arrival.

If you book accommodation through Expedia or Travelocity, for example, you pay when you make the booking. There are no refunds, so if your guests change their plans, you will be out of pocket.

We hope that makes the booking process clearer.

Around Town (1) - Afro Cuban All Stars

Direct from Havana to the Chan Centre stage, don't miss this opportunity to see the sizzling musicians of the Afro-Cuban All Stars in action. Led by Juan de Marcos González, the visionary behind the Buena Vista Social Club, this big band captures the exuberant spirit of Cuban music with a potent combination of musical virtuosity, driving percussion, powerhouse horn section and incomparable vocals. The last time they were here in 2006, audience members were caught up in the passion of the music and were dancing in the aisles.

González is gritty in his determination to fight for Cuban identity. The Afro-Cuban All Stars started as a group of legendary Cuban musicians-including such luminaries as Rubén González, Orlando Cachaíto López, Ibrahim Ferrer, many in their 70s brought back from retirement-as well as numerous young players. His multigenerational vision became reality: "I wanted to mix the generations so there is the experience of the older guys and the energy of the younger players." The mission of the Afro-Cuban All Stars is to bring the wealth, diversity and vitality of Cuban music to the world.

Ever-evolving, the great success of the band has sparked a resurrection of Cuban music both worldwide, and on the island itself with hundreds of bands now playing traditional music that once was overshadowed by American pop. Their shows are always a hit.

The All Stars appear at the Chan Shun Concert Hall on the UBC campus on Saturday, November 14th. Tickets are available at the usual outlets.

Around Town (2) – Lang Lang with the VSO

Classical music's most exciting superstar returns to the VSO with Maestro Bramwell Tovey, performing Beethoven's beautiful *Piano Concerto No. 2.* Beethoven wrote this concerto to further enhance his own reputation as a pianist and it is designed to show off a virtuoso in their prime. The great Lang Lang will leave you breathless with his dazzling interpretation of this work. Also on the program is Mendelssohn's famous *'Italian' Symphony No. 4*, one of the Classical era's most enduring works.

The concert is on Wednesday November 4th at 8pm. Buy your tickets right now, as Lang Lang's concerts in Vancouver invariably sell out.

Around Town (3) – A Chorus Line

In an empty theatree on a bare stage, casting for a new Broadway musical is almost complete. The field's been narrowed down to just 17 dancers. For these men and women, this audition is the chance of a lifetime. It's what they've worked for — with every drop of sweat, every hour of training, every day of their lives. It's the one opportunity to do what they've always dreamed of. Not to be the star, but to get the job ... to have the chance to dance and come through.



But before the final cut is made, the director Zach asks each of them to talk about themselves. He starts by asking their name, age, hometown and reason for being a dancer. But Zach wants more than just their resumes. He wants to know about their families, friends, lovers, ambitions and careers.

One by one, they come forward. Some are shy or reluctant, while others are more than happy to reveal their innermost thoughts. From funny to heartbreaking, these 17 dancers share with us the stories of their lives. They put themselves on the line to get a job on the line. And when they're done, so is the audition. And the final chorus line of 8 dancers is chosen.

The dancing begins on Tuesday November 3rd and goes until Sunday the 8th, as the Centre for Performing Arts.

Chor Leoni's 17th Annual Remembrance Day concerts take place at The Church of the Good Shepherd, 2250 150 St in Surrey on Sunday,

November 8th at 3pm, to be repeated twice on the day itself, Wednesday, November 11, 2009 at 1pm in West Vancouver United Church, 2062 Esquimalt Ave, and of course closest to us, at Christ Church Cathedral, 690 Burrard Street, at 7:30pm.
