Around the House (1) - Canada Post Regulations

This fall the venerable company will throw caution to the winds to co-present a full-scale, jazz-hands-and-all production of West Side Story, the classic Tony-Award winning Broadway Musical. The show is a 1950s era spin on Shakespeare's Romeo and Juliet, a wrong-side-of-the-tracks romance that is widely considered to be one of the greatest musicals of the 20th century.

Leonard Bernstein's rousing, swelling score coupled with Stephen Sondheim's lyrics create ear-candy melodies and timeless songs.
