Around the House (1) – Suite Front Doors

Around Town (2) – Meter Disconnections

Terasen and BC Hydro seem to have become very unforgiving about overdue gas and electricity bills. If you expect to be away from your suite for extended periods you may want to make arrangements to have your bills paid by automatic debit.



We have had several disconnections recently where owners were out of the country and their bills hadn't been taken care of in their absence.

Around the House (3) - Note from the Strata Council

To address the ongoing disruption in elevator service, the Strata Council has contracted with Gunn Consultants to assist ThyssenKrupp Elevator, our elevator service contractor, to diagnose, repair, and return our elevators to safe and reliable service. ThyssenKrupp has additionally called in an elevator control expert from Motion Control Engineering in California to help troubleshoot the system.

There is encouraging evidence that the problems may be resolved and both Gunn and ThyssenKrupp continue to monitor the situation. This, however, does not mean the end to some inconvenience. As soon as safe and reliable service is restored, the drywall work in the elevator shafts required by the BC Safety Authority must be completed. This will require a minimum of two weeks of single elevator service during the work day.

During this long ordeal, our concierge staff are doing a remarkable job in very difficult circumstances. They have worked hard to assist you in reducing the impact to your lives and routines caused by the faulty elevators. Because of anger and frustration arising from this disruption, their efforts have too often been met with unacceptable and abusive confrontations.

They are doing everything in their power to assist you and their efforts should not be rewarded with abuse. Please do not blame them for events that are completely beyond their control.
