#### Around Town (1) - Wanda Sykes



You've probably seen Wanda Sykes on the Tonight Show with Jay Leno, where she was one of his most popular guests. She has been called "one of the funniest stand-up comics" by her peers and ranks among Entertainment Weekly's

#### 25 Funniest People in America.

She was last seen in her HBO comedy special Wanda Sykes: Sick and Tired, which debuted in October 2006 and was nominated for a 2007 Primetime Emmy. It was taped before a live audience at the Moore Theatre in Seattle, and features material from her recent national tour. Among the topics covered were politics, gay marriage, karma, health care, racial profiling, the pressure of being a woman and the perks of getting older.

Sykes was recently seen in the feature films "Evan Almighty," the sequel to "Bruce Almighty," in which she co-stared with Steve Carell. She can also currently be seen on the CBS comedy "The New Adventures of Old Christine." Her first book titled *Yeah, I Said It*, published by Simon and Schuster, hit bookstores in September 2004. *Yeah, I Said It* is a hilarious collection of essays touching on life, family and current events.

Wanda Sykes will be appearing at the River Rock Casino resort in Richmond on Friday September 4<sup>th</sup> at 8pm. The show, it's perhaps unnecessary to say, is not appropriate for children.

## Around Town (2) – Dame Evelyn Glennie at the Chan Shun

Extraordinary solo percussionist Dame Evelyn Glennie joins the Manitoba Chamber Orchestra in a program of works new and old by Vivaldi, Evangelista, Duddell, Hatzis and Shostakovich. Dame Evelyn Glennie is the first person ever to successfully create and sustain a full-time career as a solo percussionist.

Diagnosed as profoundly deaf at the age of eleven, she learned to hear through sound vibrations: reaching out, even through the bare soles of her feet. As one of the most eclectic and innovative musicians on the scene today, she is constantly

redefining the goals and expectations of percussion, and creating events of great vitality. She is a dynamic, warm and thoroughly engaging artist who charms audiences of all ages with her technique, her artistry, and her eagerness to communicate.

The Manitoba Chamber Orchestra explores a section of the repertoire rarely touched by large symphony orchestras. The orchestra will be conducted on this occasion by Anne Manson, who is distinguished by her dynamic podium presence, her stylistic versatility, and her ability to draw audiences into the inner world of the composer.

The concert takes place on Saturday September 19<sup>th</sup> at 8pm. Tickets are available through the usual outlets.

Paul Brandt was born and raised in Calgary, where he sang gospel music and learned to play guitar as a child. During high school, he began playing local talent contests, singing his own songs. Instead of pursuing country music as a full-time career, he decided to attend college and study nursing. For two years, Brandt went to college and practised as a paediatric nurse at Alberta's Children's Hospital. However, he continued to enter local talent contests and to place well in each event.

The turning point in Brandt's musical career came when he entered a national contest sponsored by SOCAN. At the contest, Brandt won first prize for Best Original Canadian Country Song and placed as the runner-up for Best Performance. After the competition a demo tape of Brandt's songs made its way to Reprise's Nashville office. They arranged to see a showcase

concert by Brandt and, following the show, the label signed him.

After signing the record contract, Brandt moved to Nashville, where he recorded his debut album, "Calm Before the Storm," which was released to critical acclaim and strong sales. 
