Around Town (1) - Gran Fondo Whistler

Gran fondos are mass participation cycling events that have enjoyed incredible popularity in Europe for decades and are gaining momentum in North America.

Loosely translated from Italian, gran fondo means "big ride". These rides are often a hundred kilometres or more and designed for a large number of cyclists at a variety of skill levels - everyone from the competitive cyclist to the amateur enjoys these events. The rides are judged by the challenges they offer: steep climbs, long distances and a combination of the two. While these are not races, top finishers are often recognized.

Imagine for one day, the best possible cycling roads are closed to traffic. Before you is an epic

route with challenging climbs and thrilling descents. All you have to do is concentrate on the beauty around you. You're feeling fit and you're lined up for a huge ride with thousands of your fellow cyclists. It's not a race, so there's no pressure. You can ride at whatever pace you want.

You can even stop for a sandwich along the way they're provided. And no matter what pace you choose, you're not likely going to be riding alone. There will be a fast bunch at the front if you want to keep up with them and you can count on local spectators cheering along the way.

The scenery is better than you would see in a magazine. The ride ends with a massage and a party, and everyone's invited. Gran Fondo Canada introduced the first world-class gran fondo to Canada in 2010 with the RBC Gran Fondo Whistler, giving cyclists the unique opportunity to ride fully supported from Vancouver to Whistler on the Sea to Sky Highway in a dedicated lane.



In 2011 the RBC Gran Fondo Whistler attracted 7,000 riders from all around the globe. The route features breathtaking views of Howe Sound and challenging climbs through the Coast Mountain Range.

The race goes on Saturday September 8<sup>th</sup>, and the first wheel will cross the line at 6:45am. Early finishers are expected in Whistler soon after 10am. You'll recognize them easily – they'll be in Spandex, and gasping for breath.

Around Town (2) - Jerry Seinfeld at the Orpheum

On September 7<sup>th</sup>, Jerry Seinfeld returns to Vancouver again to perform his stand-up one man

show. His comedy, unlike that of many of his peers, is billed as being suitable for all ages.



By popular demand, he will be performing 3 shows, the Saturday one at 7pm and then 2 shows on the Sunday, at 7pm and again at 9:30pm. Tickets are available from Ticketmaster, but don't delay to order yours, as these shows will all sell out.



Around Town (3) – Clybourne Park by Bruce Norris

The Arts Club Theatre begins its 2012-2013 season with this sharp-witted comedy that won the 2011 Pulitzer Prize for best play.

This biting contemporary satire skewers the conventions of political correctness in shockingly entertaining fashion. In Chicago, 1959, an African-American family moves into a house in Clybourne Park, to the mortification of its all-white residents.



Fast-forward 50 years, and now the neighbourhood is predominately black. When young white newlyweds attempt to buy the very same house, will they face the same resistance?

The show runs from September 6<sup>th</sup> until October 7<sup>th</sup> on the Stanley Industrial Alliance Stage, which is on Granville Street at about 13<sup>th</sup>.

## **Around Town (4) – Taiwanfest 2012**

The latest iteration of Taiwanfest, a celebration of the links between Canada and Taiwan, takes place from September 1<sup>st</sup> until the 3<sup>rd</sup>. Activities include dances, games, film, arts, lectures and food. There are various venues around town, including the Vancouver Art Gallery just down the street, Robson Square Plaza (ditto) and the Scotia Bank Tower on West Georgia Street.

Around Town (5) - Scotiabank Aids Walk for Life

Living with HIV/AIDS is not a death sentence, it's a battle. It's a battle that doesn't need to be fought alone.

Support, passion and love can make a difference, and 27 years ago the Positive Living Society of BC launched the first Canadian AIDS WALK to prove it. Since then they have been walking strong. They have been walking for a change. They have been walking for life.



As of 2009 HIV/AIDS affected some 67,000 Canadians, 13,000 of whom live in BC. The Scotiabank AIDS WALK for LIFE spreads awareness of this reality and raises vital funds for those living with HIV and AIDS in our community.

But, the battle is on-going. As the Walk goes into its 27th year the organizers have set their sights high because they believe the fight can be won. To do this, they need community involvement. The Walk begins on Sunset Beach at 11am on September 23<sup>rd</sup>, and covers nearly 7km around the Stanley Park Seawall. All are welcome.

## Around Town (6) - Olio Festival

Vancouver's premiere eclectic arts and culture extravaganza returns for a 4th year, running from September 19<sup>th</sup> through the 23<sup>rd</sup>. With more than 30 events spread throughout a wide variety of Vancouver venues, Olio Festival features a diverse line up of innovative local, national, and international music, film, art, comedy, fashion, and skateboarding talent.



Since 2008, Olio has defined the ultimate collaboration of artistic disciplines in Vancouver. Their curators, veterans of their respective scenes, have orchestrated the best events for four glorious days in September, and 2012's percolations are imminent: Dozens of live music performances at Vancouver's most intimate venues; obscure, intriguing film screenings at independent theatres; up close and personal comedy to shatter your funny bone; innovative multimedia visual arts installations; and Jamcouver, the skate competition that unites riders for the best sesh since Slam City. This year, they've added fashion to our roster; trend-setters, prepare yourselves for runway action.

One wristband gets you access to everything. Olio is the epicentre of talent, culture, entertainment, and fun, bringing artists from all corners of the city, the country, and the continent, to your backyard.

They say that Jersey Boys is the musical that husbands drag their wives to. The Emmy Awardwinning production is a largely accurate rags-to-riches tale of Frankie Vallie and the Four Seasons. You'll know many of the songs, such as "Can't Take My Eyes Off Of You, Walk Like a Man, Big Girls Don't Cry, and Oh What a Night." The show is more like a play with music rather than scenes strung together to hold the music together. It's on at the Queen Elizabeth Theatre, just a 10-minute walk from One Wall, from September 5<sup>th</sup> until the 23<sup>rd</sup>.
